# PREA ANNUAL REPORT - Amended 2017

Daviess County Detention Center prepares a PREA Annual Report by reviewing data collected and aggregated in order to assess and improve the effectiveness of its sexual abuse prevention, detection and response policies, practices and training.

### 1. Comparison Report

Reportable allegations decreased by one when compared to the 2016 report, with one unfounded determination. The average number of reportable allegations for the past three years is 10.

## 2. Assess and Improve Effectiveness

The numbers of reportable allegations against staff have reduced since most pat downs are now conducted in front of a surveillance camera and inmates are not allowed to be in the shower or restrooms during head counts. The agency will continue to educate inmates, visitors and staff to help promote a safe environment for all.

#### 3. Identified Problem Areas

Problem areas are identified as they occur and during the Incident Review Team's regular meetings.

#### 4. Corrective Actions

Corrective actions are taken on an ongoing basis. Additional cameras are purchased and installed as needed.

#### 5. Findings and Corrective Actions

PREA compliance checks are now being conducted and documented to ensure all standards are being followed. Corrective action is taken as needed.

#### 6. Progress Assessment

All inmates now receive comprehensive sexual abuse/harassment education at intake instead of after they are placed in a housing unit. This is helpful for the inmates' safety and eliminates staff from needing to gather new inmates later for group training.

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
